Remembering Sister Maureen McDermott, IHM (excerpts from Catholic Philly)

The Bishop Shanahan High School community continues to mourn the loss of Sister Maureen McDermott, IHM, Chief Academic Officer and Superintendent of Secondary Schools for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, who passed away on November 17, 2021.

Sister Maureen had served as principal of BSHS for 14 years, from 2001 to 2015. She dedicated her life to Catholic education, and in particular to the spiritual formation and personal development of all students. Sister Maureen "loved high school teenagers" and had a particular love for Bishop Shanahan and its students, said Bishop Fitzgerald. "She was totally devoted to them."

She was a graduate of St. Gabriel School in South Philadelphia where she first encountered the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. She went on to Archbishop Prendergast High School for Girls in Drexel Hill, then graduated from Immaculata University in 1978 with a bachelor's degree in English.

A year later she entered the I.H.M. order, and after professing her vows, engaged in the order's charism for Catholic education. She first taught in elementary school classrooms beginning in 1982 then in Catholic secondary schools.

Along the way she earned a master's degree in English from West Chester University and a Ph.D. in Catholic educational leadership from Fordham University.

In 2001 she was named principal of Bishop Shanahan High School where she served for 14 years until rising to lead the entire Catholic secondary school system as superintendent in 2015.

After that she had overseen a high school system that has invited broad collaboration through the efforts of Faith in the Future Foundation, stabilized the rate of school enrollment decline, grown partnerships with Catholic colleges, faced the challenges of two high school closures, and the immense difficulties with continuing Catholic education during the disruptions of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Employing her copious energy and strong personality on projects, Sister Maureen "was a force of nature for the good," Maureen McCullough, Sister

Maureen's classmate and friend said. "She was good at inviting people (into a project). She could show people how they can contribute to building God's kingdom. Her legacy and work in education had a big impact on people's lives. She will be missed."

Bishop Shanahan High School's thoughts and prayers continue to be with Sister Maureen's family, IHM Congregation, friends, colleagues, and students. She will be deeply missed and forever remembered in the Shanahan community.

A head coach that gets the most out of his players and commands the respect of those players is going to be a successful head coach. Four years ago, head football coach Paul Meyers welcomed a talented freshman class to Bishop Shanahan.

All that class did was win two District 1 4A titles, and this year the Eagles advanced to the PIAA Eastern Final, won the first two state games in school history, and finished with an 11-4 record, a school record for most wins in a season.

It is for reaching those heights that Meyers is the Daily Local News Football All-Area Coach of the Year.

"This senior class was really special," Meyers said. "They were undefeated as freshmen, won a district title as sophomores, went undefeated as juniors until COVID shut us down, and this year as seniors, won another district title and two state playoff games. They were a great group to be around."

Melissa Kelly, a 2010 graduate of Bishop Shanahan High School, is making an impact in professional sports as a Studio Producer for the Philadelphia Eagles. She shares the inside scoop of her career path, advice for current students, and more!

Which experiences at Shanahan prepared you best for life after high school?

I played field hockey for all four years at Shanahan, which helped me with leadership and working with others. I also had a lot of teachers at Bishop Shanahan who really challenged me and pushed me to be my best, which is something I'll always appreciate!

Where did you go to college?

I went to Kutztown University where I got my Bachelor's degree and graduated in 2014. I studied Electronic Media and minored in journalism and public relations.

Tell us about your career with the Philadelphia Eagles!

I have been with the Philadelphia Eagles for just about 8 years. Prior to the Eagles, I interned at the Wells Fargo Center for the Flyers and 76ers ArenaVision. When that internship ended, I got another internship with the Philadelphia Eagles as a Digital Production Assistant for the 2014 season. When the 2014 season ended, I was offered a full-time job with the Philadelphia Eagles as a Production Coordinator. I spent a lot of time in the TV studio and after a couple of years, I was promoted to Studio Producer. Ever since then, I produce the Philadelphia Eagles gameday Kickoff Show, Postgame Show, NFL Draft coverage, and handle daily live press conferences and studio shoots with players and coaches.

Working in sports has always been a goal of mine ever since I was a kid. I used to go to Flyers games at the Wells Fargo Center and watch the Comcast SportsNet TV Studios through the glass of the main concourse. I fell in love with television production and knew that was the path that I wanted to take!

With the 2021 season in the books, my current project is planning our live draft coverage of the 2022 NFL draft. It is a project that takes months of planning but is rewarding when we pull it off each year!

Are there any special projects you have worked on with the Eagles?

My biggest accomplishment was being a part of the 2017 Super Bowl Champion Philadelphia Eagles. That was the hardest but most rewarding year of work in my life. We put in so many hours creating content for the fans. The Philadelphia Eagles flew every employee and a guest out to Minnesota for Super Bowl LII weekend where we got to go to the game and were treated to an incredible after party. They even gave a Super Bowl ring to every employee which is my prized possession!

My greatest accomplishment has been being able to produce content on the Eagles social media pages with such an amazing group of coworkers. We work super hard to give the fans what they want!

What advice would you give to new alumni or current students who aspire to follow a similar career path?

My advice for those that are in high school is to get as involved as possible. That is one of my biggest regrets from high school. I was involved in field hockey, but there were so many other clubs that the school offered that I wish



I took part in. For example, the club Channel 2. If I would have participated in that club, I would have gone into college with even more knowledge about television production.

For those in college, my advice is to take as many internships as you can. Every internship helps you to build your network, gain knowledge, and further advance your career. If I didn't do internships, I would never be where I am today.

I also suggest building your LinkedIn profile. That is how the Eagles found me for my internship. I didn't even know they were looking for interns. I had built a LinkedIn for a class in college and I kept it up-to-date, and the Eagles happened to stumble upon it and reached out to me.

What do you enjoy doing in your free time?

I enjoy spending time with my fiancé, Dan, and my puppy, Chloe!
