Band Class & Choir Information

Dear Members of the Class of 2026,

The study of music is an integral part of a student's program of learning. It is an area of curriculum concerned with subjective responses, positive growth, and is dependent on structured experiences. The Music Department affords each student the opportunity to develop intellectually and aesthetically. Students are given careful attention so as to discover, develop, and nurture their God-given talents. The Music Department accepts the responsibility to provide a comprehensive experience that will foster good self-esteem, good citizens, and caring children of God.

Bishop Shanahan High School offers Concert Band, Choir, and Band/Choir as an elective course. For students entering 9th grade, this course will take the place of the Related Arts/Computer Applications I one-semester courses. This class will fulfill the related arts requirement, and those students will be required to take a full-year computer course in grade 11 to fulfill the technology instruction graduation requirement. For students in grade 10, it will take the place of Health/PE. These students are required to take Health/PE in 11th or 12th grade. These music courses will be a one credit course in which students will receive Honors credit. Students who participate in diocesan, district, region, and state competitions, or attend after school rehearsals on Tuesdays and Thursdays will receive Honors credit for this course.

Students who are unable to fit Concert Band or Choir into their schedules are still able to participate. Instead of meeting during 8th period class, students will meet during arranged rehearsal times during homeroom periods and after school. Students will receive a grade for their participation, which will be part of their permanent record, but they will not receive quality points. All members of Concert Band are required to take a private weekly lesson with a staff instructor or with an outside private teacher. All members of the Concert Band are required to participate in the Bishop Shanahan High School Marching Band. The Marching Band performs at the football games, home and away, and parades. The Marching Band will be performing a field show this year! This is a fun activity that promotes school spirit. See The Arts page on the Shanahan website to sign-up.

Helpful Tips for Freshmen - Part I

School Day Time Frame

- Arrival: between 7:30 AM and 7:55 AM. All students who arrive by car, must pull into the second driveway and drop off at the Athletics Entrance. Please Note: The Media Center is open Monday Thursday from 7 AM 5 PM and Friday from 7 AM 2:45 PM.
- Regular Dismissal: 2:45 PM. Students staying after school for sports, music, and clubs will be picked up at the time designated by their respective coach or moderator.

First Day of School

- The first day of school for 9th graders is for 9th graders only! This is a great opportunity for freshmen to become familiar with lockers classes, routes in the halls, and more. Don't worry, student council and teachers stand in the halls to assist freshmen along the way.
- The first day of school for 9th graders is also 9th grade picture day! The summer school uniform will be worn on the first day of school. Students switch to their winter uniform in October.

What to Bring

• Each 9th grader should bring their Chromebook on the first day of school. If specific school supply items are needed, teachers will inform students during the first week of school. An agenda book will be given to each student during their homeroom period.

Lunchtime

• 9th graders have an assigned seating area which will be shared on the first day by the Lunch Moderator. Parents can set up an account for purchasing lunch items at shanahan.org/aramark, but cash is also accepted in the cafeteria. Students are also welcome to bring lunch from home.

Chromebook Information



Bishop Shanahan High School's incoming Freshman students are required to use Google Chromebooks*.

Purchasing a Google Chromebook is easy - just select an option below:

OPTION 1

If you already own a Google Chromebook from your previous school, you can continue to use it at BSHS. Please verify with the previous school that the Chromebook is no longer connected to their domain.

Our IT Department will need to configure it to our network and firewall specifications before the start of the school year in September 2022. A follow up letter will be sent out with information on when you can sign up for the drop off event.

OPTION 2

Purchase a Google Chromebook from your preferred retailer (minimum requirements are 16 GB of storage with 4 GB of RAM - all other features are at your discretion).

Our IT Department will need to configure it to our network and firewall specifications before the start of the school year in September 2022. A follow up letter will be sent out with information on when you can sign up for the drop-off event.
